Welcome Leader 1.

Good morning, everyone. It is brilliant so many of you have gathered to launch CSW 2024. We gather as a diocesan Faith Community to reflect, pray and celebrate all that Catholic Schools represent and achieve as centres of Faith and Excellence.

A teacher visiting Primary schools tells the story of how she asked a class she visited this question. "Who came first Adam or Eve?" Now before the feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.

And during supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray him,

Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, rose from supper, laid aside his garments, and girded himself with a towel.

Then he poured water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel with which he was girded. He came to Simon Peter; and Peter said to him, "Lord, do you wash my feet?"

Jesus answered him, "What I am doing you do not know now, but afterward you will understand."
Peter said to him, "You shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no part in me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!"

For he knew who was to betray him; that was why he said, "You are not all clean"
